Your Sponsorship Fuels:

Your sponsorship fuels Habitat for Humanity 7 Rivers Maine's work to create successful homeownership opportunities for families and individuals with limited incomes by building sustainable housing, and repairing, weatherizing, and modifying existing homes in 31 southern mid-coast Maine towns.



New Home Construction:

This Spring we are starting our next home construction project in Wiscasset. Your sponsorship will help us complete this new house and make the dream of homeownership for a local family possible.

On each new build we engage over 100 volunteers whose contributions of labor provide an estimated value of over \$50,000. Your sponsorship helps fund the materials that keep them on the job site. Plus, our Habitat homeowners provide 200 hours of "sweat equity" while their home is being built.

Critical Home Repairs:

Habitat's Critical Repair & Modification Program assists 60 mid-coast homeowners each year in need of repairs or modifications to remain living safely, securely, and independently in their homes.

These homeowners are typically older Mainers, living on a low-fixed income, who lack the resources or connections to secure labor to complete their often small but critical job. Four teams of volunteers perform basic weatherization, critical repairs, and modifications like building ramps and installing grab bars that enhance safety, mobility, and accessibility. The work is done at no cost to the homeowner, preserving their income for other basic needs like food, medication, and healthcare.


"To tell you the truth I didn't know I was going to get stuck with ten men! But they all knew what to do. It was a seamless operation, and they managed a wide range of projects... When I was taking them out to the garage to check the smoke alert I started to lurch for the table near the door as I went out. One of the men said 'you need grab bars.' So he went out to his truck and brought in two grab bars that he installed right then. Now it is perfectly safe, and I can take my walker and get out and nobody falls down! I never had to worry about materials... I never had to worry about scheduling. I never could have done this to my home on my own without their assistance."
